Treasurer's Report:

Old Business

- A donation of \$1000 was made to the Red Cross for Ukrainian Relief as per the motion from the March meeting.
- All shotgun shells that had been purchased have been sold less 5 lots held for prizes in this seasons upcoming shoots.

New Business

- Dave Anderson had a question regarding the legal challenge posed by the Springfield range against the CFO. Bill Nason explained that the challenge was due to redundant conditions attached to the ranges' operating permit issued by the CFO. The matter is still before the court.
- Dave Greene said the bank statement for March has been received & balanced. Our affiliation with the RNBRA has been renewed & the certificate will be displayed in the main seacan. Copies of our current insurance policy have been forwarded to the CFO and the property owners. The safety & accident report committee will table their recommendations to the membership for consideration. If required the Range Rules and Range Safety Orientation will be amended to reflect approved changes. Dave said the date for the CCFR's National Range Day is June 4<sup>th</sup>, and our club needed to decide on a format & where to send the proceeds. A discussion followed resulting in the formation of a committee chaired by Dan Adams, with members Bill Nason, Dave Greene, John Kelly, Dave Anderson, Dick Platt, Xavier Cole, Rob Roy, Chris Beckingham, Greg Matthews, Gord MacKenzie, & Trevor Little. The group will meet Tuesday April 19 at the Lawtons Community room. Range Clean Up day was chosen Saturday May 7<sup>th</sup>, many members are needed to assist to make it a success. We received a thank you card from the family of Clifford Christie for the donation made in his memory.
- A member questioned why steel hand gun targets are not available outside of organized shoots. Bill Nason explained that it has been attempted many times over many years to leave steel targets out but the results are always the same: they are destroyed by centerfire rifles, despite signs, warnings, and extensive coverage in the range orientation training not to shoot them. Bill suggested that if you want a key for the targets you should volunteer to assist match director Jody Waring; Dan Adams said you could bring your own steel to the range and store it in one of the many lockers in the seacan.
- Bill Nason asked new members to remain after the meeting for range safety orientation.
