Minutes of Meeting March 8, 2022

Meeting Called To Order at: 7:00 p.m.

Adoption of minutes of meeting of September 14, 2021

Treasurer's Report:

The Treasurer reported to those in attendance.

Old Business

- Dave Greene said that a second electronic targeting system has been purchased.

New Business

- Bill Nason said the pistol primers & .22 ammo the club had acquired have all been purchased. There was a single order of 9 mm left & it sold at the meeting.
- Dave Greene reviewed bank statements from December, January, and February and they have all been balanced. An acknowledgement and receipt for our donation was received from Portage Atlantic. The annual club information sheet has been submitted to the CFO. A \$600 grant was sent to the River Valley Volunteer Hunter Instructor Association for youth training. Four \$25 gift cards were received using our Visa points; they will be used for shoot prizes. Dave would like to see a safety & accident report form developed for use at the range; volunteers needed to complete task. Already this year 74% of membership has renewed for 2022. 2021 had a record 515 members; in 2006 we had 81. The range was used 320 days last year (89.1%) with 2,565 member visits or an average of 5 trips/member. Guest visits were 242. Insurance provider Holman Brokers has been chosen again as they have the best rates by far. Dave is working on securing a shotgun shell purchase once pricing is confirmed. Dana Russell Memorial Shotgun Shoot is scheduled for September 17, Scout Appreciation Day September 10th. A grant request has been forwarded to the NBWTF for the Scout event. The NBWTF asked the club to donate a prize for their 25th anniversary celebration; a good set of binoculars were purchased for this. The club has received generous funding from the NBWTF over the years. There will be an examination of the pistol bay area this year to see if it's possible two more can be added. We also need to install a rain gutter at the 25/50 yard firing line.
- Member Frank Osmon made a motion that the club donate \$1000 to assist Ukraine in their struggle against the Russian invasion. A short discussion took place as to which organization would be best; Dave Greene suggested the Red Cross. After this clarification the motion was seconded by Dave Anderson, and passed unanimously.
- Bill Nason said he has received numerous complaints regarding how difficult the main gate is to open. Blake Tibbetts suggested a single-arm design such as the one used by the Hampton club. Vice President John Kelly said he would contact a fabricator to look into the matter.
- Dave Greene asked for a volunteer to audit the financials; member Ian Ross came forward.
- Bill Nason asked new members to remain after the meeting for range safety orientation.
