Old Business

- Canadian Tire west was contacted regarding a donation for the Dana Russell memorial shotgun shoot and they responded by providing a 12 gun vault. Many thanks for their generous donation.

New Business

- Bill Nason attempted to contact the DNR regarding regulations on magazine capacities for now-legal center fire rifles for varmint hunting, specifically pistol-caliber carbines which usually have only 10 round magazines. He was referred to the Canadian Firearms Center by the DNR, who then referred him back to the DNR. He attempted to contact the minister of Natural Resources Mike Holland but was given a non-answer by a staff member of the ministry. Dan Adams suggested contacting the minister via social media; he said he would give it a try.
- Dave Greene said the bank statement for August has been received and is not balanced due a difference of \$5.01 which he is attempting to find.
- Dave Greene said the Dana Russell Memorial Shotgun Shoot took place September 11th with 25 registered shooters. Winner of the event was Stan McGrattan with 85/100, 2nd was Tom White with 84/100, 3rd was Jim Harper with 82/100. Isaac Gallant was high scoring Junior & Tracy Roberts was high scoring Ladies shooter. Trevor Little won the Stevens 555 shotgun. Many thanks to all who assisted in making the event a success by volunteering their time, and thanks to Dave Greene for again putting on a great shoot. This concludes organized shotgun events for this year, there may be a flush later in the fall.
- Bill Nason thanked Nick Munn for holding a 200 yard rifle shoot on September 12th. The event was well attended and made use of two remote targeting systems, one belonging to the club and the other provided by President of the RNBRA Stephen Stewart who attended the shoot. This raised the question of the need for a second system for the club. The price is reasonable and the unit is a game changer for such a shoot.
